## Origami Shirt & Necktie Gift Card Holder

## **Supplies**

Paper:

- Designer Series Paper (Gingham Garden #129310), Cut Shirt = 6"x10", Cut Tie = 3-1/2" x 3-1/2"
- Card Stock (Whisper White #100730), For Insert Cut 2-1/2 x 2-1/2 (approximate)

Stamps & Ink:

 Delightful Dozen (#122652 [c], #128547 [w])Classic Ink (Night of Navy #126970)

Tools:

- Bone Folder (#102300)
- Paper Snips (#103579)
- Stampin' Trimmer (#126889)

Adhesives:

- Glue Dots (#103683) or Sticky Strip (#104294)
- Snail Adhesive (#104332)

**Important Tips:** Your best friend for this project is your Bone Folder. Use it whenever you make a fold unless otherwise noted. All products are used are from Stampin'Up!

## Shirt Instructions:

1. With desired pattern facing down (front of shirt), fold 6"x10" Designer Series Paper (DSP) in half lengthwise.




2. Open the fold, keeping the front facing down. The inside of the shirt will be facing you. On both sides, fold the long edge in to meet the center crease created in Step 1.





4. Close the folds back up.



5. Using the point shown above as your marker, fold the bottom edge up.



6. The next few steps will create the "sleeves". It can be tricky but don't give up. Open the fold created in Step 5 as shown below. Grab the inside corner, along the fold and bring to the outer edge. Do this to both sides.








8. Turn the whole piece over to reveal the sleeves. With the sleeves at the bottom, fold the top edge down about  $\frac{1}{2}$ " as shown below.



9. Creating the Collar. Flip the piece back over again. Fold the top corners of the last folded edge (from Step 8) as shown below.



10. Bring the bottom up and tuck under the points of the collar. Crease the bottom.



## **Tie Instructions:**


1. With desired pattern facing down (front of tie), fold 3-1/2"x3-1/2" Designer Series Paper (DSP) in half, diagonally.




2. Open the folded piece. Fold the corners on each side in as shown below.



3. Turn the folded piece over. Bring the top point down about half way and crease.





5. Using the point for folding placement, fold the top up again and crease.



6. Creating the Tie Knot. Fold the little corners up. If you're using heavy DSP, the paper will be difficult to fold. This fold is not firmly creased.



7. Flip the tie over. Fold each edge in to the center line and crease the edges.



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9. Finish by affixing the tie to the outside of the shirt with Glue Dots or Sticky Strip.
